- The embedded link does **not** direct to an official UMaine or Evergreen State College resource.

## What you should do:

- **Do not click any links** or download attachments in this message.
- If you received the email, delete it immediately.
- If you clicked the link or entered any login information, please change your password immediately and contact the IT Help Desk.

Phishing emails can look convincing, but remember: official health and safety announcements will always come directly from recognized University offices, not through unexplained forwards.
