

Phishing email analysis





Does this appear to be a phishing email and why?

Yes — this email strongly appears to be a **phishing / job scam** attempt.

Here's why:

1. Suspicious sender vs. recipient mismatch

- The email was sent from @thedoodleinc.com, a domain unrelated to the University of Maine System.
- A legitimate university job posting should come from an official @maine.edu address.

2. Fake professor contact

3. Urgency & pressure tactics

- The subject is "URGENT!!!!" with multiple exclamation marks.
- The body stresses "first-come, first-served" to push students into acting quickly without thinking.

4. Too good to be true offer

 Promises of easy remote work for \$400 per week with no specific duties described. This is a common lure in job scams targeting students.

5. Data harvesting attempt

• The email asks for **full name**, **email**, **department**, **phone number**, **year of study** — information that can be used for identity theft or further scams.

6. Spoofed credibility

• The sender signs off as from the "Department of Line 1985, University of Maine System," but there is no legitimate link or verification.

✓ Verdict: This is not legitimate and should be reported as a phishing / job scam.
